The scope of registration for the Burke Demolition Integrated Management System (IMS) will cover the provision of demolition, asbestos abatement, and recycling.

The Directors of Burke Demolition are responsible for ensuring this policy is communicated, understood, and applied throughout the company. The Quality Policy shall be made available to relevant interested parties, as appropriate and maintained as documented information. All employees are encouraged to identify areas for improvement within the organisation and relay these suggestions to top management who shall ensure they are reviewed and implemented where appropriate.

The directors have the ultimate responsibility for the effective and economic operation of the management system. They have the responsibility and authority for identifying quality requirements in the company and for implementing the actions necessary to meet those needs and in so doing meet the requirements of the management system standards, ISO 9001, ISO 14001, and ISO 45001.
